2021 Program of Work

non-renewals.

Ambassadors:

We plan to build an active group of 10-15 active Ambassadors. Ambassadors will assist
with Ribbon Cuttings, Business Before and After Hours, and other events. Ambassadors
work with new member engagement and will help communicate the mission and goals
of the Chamber. Often, they will serve as greeters at our major events and will work
with the Chamber staff to assist with details and programming.

Membership Development:

The membership committee will work with the Chamber staff to develop a list of potential members and former members of the Chamber to reach out to encourage growth in our membership. The membership committee will assist with the quarterly Business After Hours by inviting potential new members and encouraging existing membership to attend.

Projects for 2021 include:

- Develop a mechanism for gathering input from local business owners on new business development and using that input to work with Pride of Kinston, Lenoir County Economic Development, and the Lenoir County Committee of 100 as opportunities arise.
- Update the TLC (Think Lenoir County) and/or (Buy Local) program encouraging local shopping and purchasing of services and create a coalition of participating Lenoir County businesses that can, as a group, take advantage of opportunities to advertise under the TLC Banner or Buy Local Banner.

- Re-Visit the Red-Carpet Gift Card program that welcomes individuals relocating to our community by presenting them with a welcome gift card package. Expand the catalogue of participating businesses and promote this program to HR Managers, Realtors, and the public.
- Create awareness with Human Resources managers, realtors, and the public about the importance of a live locally program. Work with Committee of 100 on updating the ExecuStay list of available temporary housing to be available to HR managers.
